On-Campus Accommodations

University of Manitoba Residences

We will be using three different student residences. All rooms are supplied with bedding, towels, soap and a glass. Coin operated laundry facilities are available in each residence. Only the Arthur V. Mauro residence is air-conditioned. Limited parking is available.

Arthur V. Mauro Residence opened in September 2003 and consists of self-contained suites. Each suite contains two bedrooms, each with a double bed, phone and internet access, a bathroom with shower and a kitchenette with a sink, fridge, microwave, table and chairs. This residence has no dining hall.

Speechly Hall is an older ten-story high-rise containing both single and double rooms, arranged in small clusters. Washrooms are shared and centrally located.

Tache Hall is the oldest residence, built in 1912 in a classic design of brick and limestone. It also has both single and double rooms and centrally located shared washrooms.

Complimentary breakfasts for all delegates staying in Speechly, Tache and Arthur Mauro Residences will be served in the dining room on the 2nd floor of Pembina Hall, located between Speechly and Tache Halls, across the street from Mauro Residence.

Parking

All delegates staying in residence may request a parking pass valid for the duration of their stay at Congress. Delegates staying offcampus can bring their vehicles to campus and park in the University Parkade. Parking meters and ticket dispenser parking lots are also available. The Visitor Centre at 423 University Crescent can provide additional information, change for the meters or maps to convenient visitor parking.

L'hébergement sur le campus

Résidences de la University of Manitoba

Trois résidences d'étudiants seront à la disposition des congressistes. La literie, les serviettes, une savonnette et un verre seront fournis avec chaque chambre. Chaque résidence est équipée d'une laverie automatique. Seule la résidence Arthur V. Mauro est climatisée. Un parc de stationnement limité est disponible.

Ouverte depuis septembre 2003, la **Résidence Arthur V. Mauro** comporte des suites autonomes. Chaque suite se compose de deux chambres avec lit à deux places, téléphone et accès à l'Internet, salle de bains avec douche et cuisinette avec évier, réfrigérateur, four micro-ondes et table avec chaises. Cette résidence ne comprend pas de salle à manger.

Le **Pavillon Speechly** est un bâtiment plus ancien de dix étages comprenant à la fois des chambres individuelles et doubles, disposées en petits groupes. Les salles de bains sont communes et situées au centre de chaque étage.

Le **Pavillon Tache** est la résidence la plus ancienne, construite en 1912, en briques et pierre calcaire. Il comprend lui aussi des chambres individuelles et doubles et des salles de bains communes.

Des petits déjeuners gratuits sont offerts à tous les délégués dans la salle à manger de deuxième étage du Pavillon Pembina, situé entre les Pavillons Speechly et Tache, en face de la résidence Mauro.
